School Responsibilities

Connecticut Farms Elementary School will:

 - *Implement both fully curriculum resources (Discovery Education & Tynker) as well as supplemental resources (I Know It & Arcademics) to allow teachers access to various high quality resources.*
 - *Use regular check ins with teachers as well as data checks to ensure student progress.*

2. Hold annual parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held;
 - *Conferences will be held on the days and times provided by the teachers of each grade level & class and communicated through email, flyers, and other parent-teacher communication resources such as Class Dojo & Google Classroom.*

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows;

- *Annually during parent-teacher conferences*
 - *Twice a year through Title I Progress Report*
 - *Parent Portal (Genesis)*
4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows;
 - *By phone, email, meetings, parent communication resources (Class Dojo, Google Classroom etc.), and scheduled parent-teacher conferences*
 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows;
 - *Acknowledging that parents are vital to the success of the student and this school community*
 - *Advertising and offering volunteer opportunities when needed*
 - *Allowing for parent input into future programs*
 6. Hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements, and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a convenient time to parents, and will offer a flexible number of additional parent and family engagement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs (participating students), and will encourage them to attend.
