## HIB Reporting and Investigation Timelines:

- 1. All acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying (HIB) shall be reported verbally to the school principal on the same daywhen the school employees or contracted service provider witnessed or received reliable information regarding any such incident.
- The principal shall inform the parents or guardians of <u>ALL</u>studentsinvolved in the alleged incident, and may discuss, as appropriate, the availability of counseling, and other intervention services.
- All acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying shall be reported in writing to the building
  principal within school two (2)daysof when the school employee or contracted service provider
  witnessed or received reliable information that a student had been subject to harassment,
  intimidation or bullying.
- 4. An investigation shall be initiated by the principal or the principal's designee within one (1) school day of the report of the incident and shall be conducted by a school anti-bullying specialist. The principal may appoint additional personnel who are not school anti-bullying specialists to assist in the investigation.
- 5. The investigation shall be completed as soon as possible, but not later than ten (10) school days from the date of the written report of the incident. In the event that there is information relative to the investigation that is anticipated but not yet received by the end of the ten (10) day period, the school anti-bullying specialist may amend the original report of the results of the investigation to reflect the information.
- 6. The results of the investigationshall be reported to the superintendent of schools within two (2) days of the completion of the investigation, and the superintendent may decide to provide intervention services, establish trainingprograms to reduce harassment, intimidation or bullying and enhance school climate, impose discipline, or order counseling as a result of the findings of the investigation, or take or recommend other appropriate action.
- 7. The results of each investigationshall be reported to the board of education no later than the date of the board of education meeting next following the completion of the investigation, along with information on any services, provided, training established, discipline imposed, or other action taken or recommended by the superintendent.
- 8. Parents or guardians of the studentswho are parties of the investigationshall be entitled to receive information about the investigation, including the nature of the investigation, whether

the district found evidence of HIB or whether discipline was imposed or services provided to address the incident of HIB. This information shall be provided in writing within five (5)school days after the results are reported to the board.

- 9. A parent or guardian may request a hearing before the boardafter receiving the information, and the hearing shall be held within ten (10 )days of the request. The board shall meet in executive session for the hearing to protect confidentiality of the students. At the hearing the board may hear from the school-anti-bullying specialist about the incident, recommendation for discipline or services, and any programs instituted to reduce such incidents.
- 10. At the next board of education meeting following its receipt of the report, the board shall issue a decision, in writing, to affirm. Reject, or modify the superintendent's decision. The board's decision may be appealed to the Commissioner of Education, in accordance with the procedures set forth in law and regulation, no later than 90 days after the issuance of the board's decision.
- 11. A parent, student, guardian, or organization may file a complaint with the Division on Civil Rights within 180 days of the occurrence of any incident of HIB based on the membership in a protected group as enumerated in the "Law Against Discrimination," P.L. 1945, c. 169 (C. 10:5-1 et seq.)
